BALLOT MEASURES

CANYON COUNTY AMBULANCE DISTRICT TO ESTABLISH A PERMANENT OVERRIDE TAX LEVY

QUESTION:

Shall the Canyon County Ambulance District Board, through a permanent override tax levy election to be held on May 21, 2024, pursuant to Idaho Code 63-802(1)(h) be authorized and empowered to permanently increase its property tax budget and levy beyond the amount provided for under Idaho Code 63-802(1)(a) in the amount of seven million nine hundred eighty two thousand and no/100 dollars [\$7,982,000.00] commencing October 1, 2024, and which shall thereafter be permanently added to the base budget for the purposes of Idaho Code 63-802?

The purpose of this tax increase is to hire additional paramedics, EMTs and support staff, equip and maintain the Ambulance District's operations, repair existing ambulances and vehicles, purchase additional ambulances, and facilities,

and to generally defray the cost of providing emergency medical services commencing October 1, 2024.

I.C. 34-914 Statement: The District currently levies a tax of \$10.03 per \$100,000 of taxable assessed value, per year. The estimated annual cost to the taxpayer of the proposed levy is a tax of \$31.22 per \$100,000 of taxable assessed value, per year, based on current conditions. Thus, if the proposed levy is approved, the tax per \$100,000 of taxable assessed value is expected to increase by \$21.19 per year. The proposed increase will be permanent.

The purpose of this tax increase is to defray its costs of staffing, equipping, and maintaining the District's operations to provide protection of property against fire and the preservation of life, throughout the Fire District.

STATEMENT: The levy will be used to fund District operations and will be a tax increase of approximately \$65.84 per \$100,000 of

to defray its costs of staffing, equipping, and maintaining the District's operations to provide protection of property against fire and the preservation of life, throughout the Fire District.

The levy will be used to fund District operations and will be a tax increase of approximately \$53.83 per \$100,000 of taxable assessed value, per year, based upon current conditions.

The following information is required by 34-913, Idaho Code:

The purpose for which the proposed bonds are to be issued, the date of the special municipal bond election (May 21, 2024), and the principal amount of the bonds are set forth above on the ballot or in the proposition. The interest rate anticipated on the proposed bonds based on current market rates is 3.59% per annum. The total amount to be repaid over the life of the proposed bonds, principal, and interest, based on the anticipated interest rate, is estimated to be \$53,910,817, consisting of \$38,000,000 in principal and \$15,910,817 in interest. The estimated average annual cost to the taxpayer of the proposed bonds is a tax of \$18.00 per \$100,000 of taxable assessed value, per year, based on current conditions. The proposed bonds will mature within twenty (20) years from the date of each series of bonds. The total existing indebtedness of the City, including interest accrued as of May 21, 2024, is \$155,840,619.
