Middleton School District No. 134 Supplemental Levy

The Board of Trustees of School District No. 134, Canyon County, State of Idaho, is seeking authorization to levy a Supplemental Levy for the following purposes and approximate amount of levy funds to be allocated to each use:

Purpose: Certified Teachers
Amount: \$402,016.00

Purpose: Classified Staff
Amount: \$374,193.00

Purpose: Resource/Security Officers
Amount: \$275,000.00

Purpose: Pay to Participate
Amount: \$45,000.00

Purpose: Curriculum Adoption
Amount: \$500,000.00

Purpose: Transportation
Amount: \$40,000.00

Purpose: Technology
Amount: \$250,000.00

Purpose: Building Maintenance
Amount: \$100,000.00

TOTAL ANNUAL LEVY AMOUNT: \$1,986,209/year

QUESTION: Shall the Board of Trustees of School District No. 134, Canyon County, State of Idaho, be authorized and empowered to levy a Supplemental Levy in the amount of One Million Nine Hundred Eighty-Six Thousand Two Hundred and Nine Dollars (\$1,986,209) per year for two (2) years, commencing with the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2026 and ending June 30, 2028, for the purposes stated above; all as provided in the Resolution adopted by the Board of Trustees on March 9, 2026?

The estimated average annual cost to the taxpayer on the proposed levy is a tax of \$41 per \$100,000 of taxable assessed value, per year, based on current conditions. The proposed levy replaces an existing levy that expires on June 30, 2026, and that currently costs \$31 per \$100,000 of taxable assessed value. Therefore, if the proposed levy is approved, the tax per \$100,000 of taxable assessed value is expected to increase by \$10 per \$100,000 of taxable assessed value.

Middleton Rural Fire District Two-Year Temporary Budget Levy Increase

The Middleton Rural Fire District has grown by 27% since 2020. Annual calls for emergency services have increased from 1,500 in 2020 to over 2,000 in 2025 and unit response times continue to increase. The increased demand for emergency services has outpaced the District's manpower and annual budget authority.

Due to legislation passed in 2020 to decrease property taxes, the District's limited annual budget authority has NOT kept up and an increase is necessary to cover personnel and annual operating costs. The requested increase will also fund firefighter safety equipment, the annual cost of full-time staffing and operating expenses for the new station located on Harvey Rd. that is being constructed with Impact Fees paid by new development.

Specifically, a TEMPORARY levy increase of two million two hundred twenty five thousand dollars (\$2,225,000) per year, for two years, to the District's annual budget from property tax is needed, beyond the amount the District is currently authorized to levy pursuant to Idaho Code §63-802, a TWO YEAR TEMPORARY levy override, to commence Fiscal Year 2027, and which amount shall then be added to the District's budget provided for under Idaho Code §63-802.

I.C. §34-914 Statement: The budget increase to fund the cost of staffing and operating the new fire station, and to maintain current District operations, is currently estimated to be an increase of \$54.73 per \$100,000 of taxable assessed value, per year, this estimate is based upon the value of taxable property within the fire district in 2025.

Shall the Board of Commissioners of the Middleton Rural Fire District be authorized and empowered to a TEMPORARY increase to its annual budget levy for a period of two years, commencing Fiscal Year 2027, pursuant to Idaho Code Section 63-802(3)?

Star Fire Protection District Two-Year Temporary Budget Levy Increase

The Star Fire Protection District has grown by 70% since 2020. Annual calls for emergency services have increased from 877 in 2020 to 1,715 in 2025 and unit response times continue to get longer, impacting our ability to meet the needs of our community. This dramatic growth and increased demand for emergency services has outpaced the District's manpower and annual budget authority.

Due to legislation passed in 2020 to decrease property taxes, the District's limited annual budget authority has NOT kept up and an increase is necessary to cover personnel and annual operating costs. The requested increase will also fund firefighter safety equipment, the annual cost of full-time staffing and operating expenses for the new fire station located on Floating Feather that was built with Impact Fees, paid by new development.

Specifically, a TEMPORARY levy increase of two million two hundred twenty five thousand dollars (\$2,225,000) per year, for two years, to the District's annual budget from property tax is needed, beyond the amount the District is currently authorized to levy pursuant to Idaho Code §63-802, a TWO YEAR TEMPORARY levy override, to commence Fiscal Year 2027, and which amount shall then be added to the District's budget provided for under Idaho Code §63-802.

I.C. §34-914 Statement: The budget increase to fund the cost of staffing and operating the new fire station, and to maintain current District operations, is currently estimated to be an increase of \$37.69 per \$100,000 of taxable assessed value, per year, this estimate is based upon the value of taxable property within the fire district in 2025.
